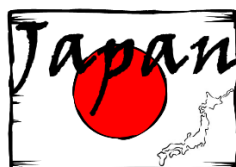
"The most certain way to succeed is to just try one more time."

Student Attendance

A reminder to all parents/carers that students arriving late to school must have a note of explanation from the parent/carer or have a parent/carer sign their child into school.

Also, students who wish to sign out of school early must have a note signed by the parent/carer, which must be presented at Roll Call. If this isn't possible, the parent/carer must come to the Office to sign their child out.

Attendance Printouts

Students will be receiving attendance printouts this week. Parents/carers are asked to check absence codes and justify any unexplained absences by returning the printout with the explanation, and signed by the parent/carer to the Roll Call teacher.

The attendance codes are as follows;

W- the student was absent for the whole day.

P- the student was late or was absent for part of the day.

A- the student's absence is unexplained or unjustified.

S- the student's absence is due to sickness or some sort of medical appointment.

L- an explanation for an absence has been received and accepted e.g. funeral.

B- the student was absent from school on official school business e.g. school excursion.

Teaching Good Habits

It is important for parents to make attending school a priority. Allowing children days off for birthdays, to look after younger children, to go shopping, to keep you company or because they were tired from a late night not only sends the wrong message to your child, it is also against the law.
